Executive Overview: Microsoft WPP & Konica Minolta Readiness

What is Windows Protected Print (WPP)?

- A new secure print mode in Windows 11 that eliminates legacy print drivers
- Uses Microsoft's IPP Class Driver for universal, driverless printing
- Enforces modern security hardening (encrypted channels, reduced privilege spooler, driver blocklisting).

Why It Matters

- Security: Blocks decades of print driver vulnerabilities
- Simplicity: No more driver management
- Future-Proofing: Aligns with Microsoft's print driver deprecation timeline (2026–2027).

How Customers Benefit Today

- IPPS (IPP over HTTPS) printing is already supported on Konica Minolta bizhub i-Series
- Customers can enable WPP mode now and enjoy:
 - Encrypted job submission (TLS 1.2/1.3)
 - Driverless setup via Windows auto-discovery
 - Core feature coverage (duplex, finishing if supported by IPP attributes).

What's Coming Next

- Konica Minolta Print Support App (PSA) will be released in Oct/Nov 2025 via the Microsoft Store
- Adds advanced features on top of the secure IPP Class Driver path:
 - Finishing options
 - Secure print release
